



Mayors Council of Oklahoma: Mayor Mentor Program

One on one and in informal area networks, Oklahoma mayors help each other “get the job done.” Sign up to be a mentor or to network with an experienced mayor. Mayors share “how to’s” with each other. On the job training doesn’t have to be reinventing the wheel.

TO BE A MENTOR:

- 1) Be in office for one or more years.
- 2) Be willing to share your experience and knowledge of resources with a fellow elected mayor.
- 3) Be willing to meet personally at least once with your fellow mayor.
- 4) Be available for consultation by telephone or email to visit with the mayor that you are helping.
- 5) Make a commitment to help until either you or the mayor that you are helping leaves office or for a minimum of one year.
- 6) Be prepared to make a new friend who shares common concerns for their community.

TO HAVE A FELLOW MAYOR AVAILABLE TO CONSULT WITH YOU:

- 1) Be a mayor for less than one year.
- 2) Be willing to benefit from contact with a more experienced mayor for a maximum period of one year.
- 3) Be available to meet personally with your mentor mayor at least once.
- 4) Be able to schedule your contact with your mentor to respect their availability.
- 5) Be prepared to make a new friend who shares common concerns for their community.
